He is an articulate and media savvy critic, and author of "The More You Watch, The Less You Know". Schechter writes for Newsday and The Nation and appears regularly on radio and TV shows, having been a former radio news director and talk show host. Saturday May 22rd at 3 PM: Speaker is Adjunct Professor Barry Lituche, of Kingsborough Community College CUNY, where he teaches Modern European History. He is author of numerous articles on the Yugoslavian crisis and he has spoken as commentator on various radio shows. In 1995 he interviewed Yugoslavian political figures and Krajina refugees during the NATO bombings. Dr. Lituche is Director of the Jasenovacs Institute, named for the largest concentration camp in the Balkans, and which is concerned with Yugoslavian holocaust and Human Rights issues.
